## 1.1 Promoting Awareness on Sexual and Reproductive Health

The University is committed to promoting awareness and access to information related to sexual and reproductive health, gender safety, and preventive healthcare among students. Through workshops, awareness programmes, and healthcare initiatives, the University seeks to create an informed campus environment where students are encouraged to understand issues related to personal safety, consent, reproductive health, and disease prevention. These initiatives aim to equip young learners with accurate knowledge, promote responsible behaviour, and support the overall well-being of the university community.

### 1.1.1 Awareness on Consent, Personal Safety and Gender Justice (10<sup>th</sup> November 2025)

To promote awareness on issues related to personal safety, consent, and gender justice, the Faculty of Legal Studies organized a One-Day Youth Workshop on “Understanding Boundaries and Staying Safe.” **The workshop was conducted in collaboration with the Association for Advocacy and Legal Initiatives (AALI)**, a Lucknow-based organization working on legal awareness and gender justice. The interactive session focused on important themes such as personal boundaries, sexual consent, healthy relationships, and the legal protections available under Indian law, particularly for women. The programme concluded with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the University and AALI, paving the way for future collaboration in promoting legal awareness and gender justice initiatives.

### 1.1.2 HPV Vaccination and Cervical Cancer Prevention Initiative

As part of its commitment to preventive healthcare and reproductive health awareness, the University organized a Free Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccination Campaign aimed at preventing cervical cancer among young women. The initiative focused on spreading awareness about HPV infection and encouraging vaccination as an effective preventive measure. During the first phase of the campaign, eligible female students aged 15–26 years received the first dose of the HPV vaccine, along with an awareness session explaining cervical cancer, the role of HPV infection, and the importance of vaccination. In the subsequent phase, the second dose of the vaccine was administered to the participating students as per the recommended schedule.

The campaign not only provided free vaccination but also helped raise awareness about preventive healthcare practices, early protection against cervical cancer, and the importance of immunization in safeguarding women’s reproductive health.
