1. ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University (KMCLU), Lucknow (U.P.), is a State Public multidisciplinary and multilingual University with a distinctive academic focus on languages, humanities, social sciences, professional education, and emerging technologies. The University integrates linguistic scholarship with interdisciplinary and skill-based learning, aligning its mission with India's National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and global higher-education benchmarks.

The University promotes multilingualism while fostering research, employability, innovation, and social responsibility. In **2025**, KMCLU received its **first NAAC accreditation with B++ Grade**, demonstrating compliance with national quality benchmarks in academic governance, infrastructure, and institutional planning.

KMCLU was established under the **Uttar Pradesh Universities Act, 2009**, and was named as **Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University** in 2020 to reflect its expanded linguistic and academic mandate. Recognized under **Sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC**, the University adheres to nationally approved academic and governance standards.

Located in Uttar Pradesh, the heartland of India, the University aims to provide quality education and deep understanding of India's cultural fabric, inspiring students to build a knowledge-based society. The first academic session of the University began in August 2013 with U.G, P.G and Diploma programmes in various fields. Currently, the strength of students in the University exceeds **5,000** with more than 70 programmes being offered in the current academic year.

The University offers a rich learning environment for students belonging to different parts of the country. Since 2019, the University has enriched its curriculum by introducing AICTE approved B. Tech. programmes in Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Biotechnology, Computer Science and Engineering with a specialization in Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning. Further expanding its academic horizons, the University launched its LL.M. programme under the Faculty of Legal Studies in the Academic Session, 2021-22, along with an M. Tech. programme under the Faculty of Engineering and Technology. Additionally, from the Academic Session 2022-23 the University introduced LLB and BA.LLB programmes and established the Faculty of Pharmacy with B.Pharm and D.Pharm programmes. **Recently the University has started to offer a U.G. Course in Awadhi language**



The University offers a wide range of postgraduate programmes aimed at fostering academic excellence and interdisciplinary learning. Postgraduate courses are available in diverse disciplines such as Zoology, Biotechnology, Microbiology, Sociology and Biotechnology Engineering, catering to the academic and professional aspirations of students.

To support teaching, learning, and research, the University provides high-speed digital connectivity with a 1 Gbps Wi-Fi network across the campus.

The institution also promotes physical fitness and holistic development through well-maintained outdoor and indoor sports courts for various games. The University actively encourages blended and digital learning by facilitating access to **SWAYAM** and other **MOOC** platforms, enabling students to benefit from nationally and internationally recognized online courses.

In addition, the University runs the **C.M. Abhyudaya Yojana**, offering dedicated coaching and guidance for aspirants preparing for Civil Services and other competitive examinations. To nurture innovation and entrepreneurship, the University has established the Awadh Incubation Centre, providing mentorship and support for start-ups and innovative ideas. The Awadhi Shodhpeth serves as a center for research and preservation of regional language, culture, and heritage.

KMCLU's academic programmes prepare graduates for employment in **education, media, translation, journalism, public administration, cultural industries, international relations, and emerging technology sectors**. The University has strengthened employability outcomes through skill-development initiatives, and interdisciplinary exposure in accordance with NEP 2020.

KMCLU is actively strengthening its research culture through interdisciplinary initiatives and infrastructure development. The establishment of **Internet of Things (IoT) and Artificial Intelligence Networking Laboratories** supports applied research and training in **Machine Learning, and Data Science**, bridging humanities, language studies, and technology.

The University's official academic platforms document ongoing **research projects, publications, and memorandum of understanding**, indicating sustained scholarly activity and institutional engagement. These initiatives contribute to KMCLU's growing research output and network development.

KMCLU demonstrates structured institutional commitment to the **United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**, aligning with the international emphasis on sustainability and social responsibility. Innovation and entrepreneurship are promoted through start-up incubation initiatives under the **Awadh Incubation Foundation**, supporting local economic and social development.

Guided by its vision to achieve excellence in language, education, research, and innovation, Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University is committed to nurturing learners who are productive, responsible, ethical, creative, and compassionate members of society. The University fosters a culture of inclusion, mutual respect, and collaboration among faculty, students, and staff, creating an enabling environment for academic excellence. Through the preservation of the Indian Knowledge System and the advancement of Indian and foreign languages using modern technologies, KMCLU integrates tradition with innovation. Its educational philosophy emphasizes value-based learning, transparent work ethics, community engagement, extension activities, and participative leadership, ensuring a transformative student experience. By expanding access to diverse populations and global opportunities, the University prepares graduates to lead in language, research, innovation, critical thinking, and nation-building, contributing meaningfully to society at both national and international levels.



2. INFRASTRUCTURE & SERVICES

The University has several infrastructural amenities to cater to the academic needs of the students.

2.1 ABUL KALAM AZAD ACADEMIC BLOCK

The Academic Block of the University features well-equipped classrooms equipped with projectors to facilitate audio-visual teaching and learning. It has an auditorium, faculty rooms for instructors and seminar/conference halls for engaging in debates, discussions and other academic endeavours. To ensure convenience for both students and teachers, each floor of the academic building features a dedicated reading room, fostering a conducive environment for learning and scholarly activities.



2.2 LABORATORIES

The Academic Building of the University hosts laboratories for students and research scholars, providing training in software operation and data analysis for their research endeavours. The Department of Computer Science maintains an internet supported Computer Lab accessible to faculty members and students for research and academic purposes. Additionally, all other departments are equipped with computer labs to enhance students' proficiency in utilizing ICT within their respective fields. The labs and workshops of Chemistry, Physics, Electrical, Electronics, Biotechnology, Pharmacy, Civil and Mechanical as well as Media Lab help students in practical training related to their areas of specialization.

The Faculty of Sciences is well equipped with modern laboratories across various departments, including Zoology, Biotechnology, Microbiology, Botany, Chemistry, and related disciplines.

In alignment with global standards for language proficiency, the University has established state-of-the-art language labs. Departments of Arabic, Persian, Urdu and other foreign languages like English and French, are equipped with their own language labs where students are trained to hone up their skills of language proficiency.





2.3 ACHARYA NARENDRAN DEV ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING

The striking Administrative Building stands as a prominent landmark welcoming students and visitors upon entering the University campus. Throughout the day, this block is bustling with activity, managing a wide array of student affairs and financial matters. Additionally, the offices of the Vice Chancellor, Finance Officer, Controller of Examinations and Registrar are housed within this building.



2.4 STUDENTS' FACILITY CENTRE (SFC)

The Student Facility Center (SFC) commenced operations in the academic year 2021-22. It offers various student amenities, including a canteen, print and photocopy shop and stationary shop. A branch of ICICI Bank with 24x7 ATM facility is available. There is also a provision for an Open Theater for students. A common room for girls, along with a hobby room furnished with indoor games, has been established to offer recreational opportunities for female students. Furthermore, the building accommodates offices for the National Cadet Corps (NCC) and National Service Scheme (NSS), which spearhead various social welfare initiatives within and beyond the University campus.



2.5 GANESH SHANKAR VIDYARTHI STUDY CENTRE

The Study Centre represents the University's latest addition to its impressive infrastructure. Designed to foster learning and research endeavors, the Centre accommodates the Department of Home Science, Department of Journalism and Mass Communication and the Department of English & Modern European and Asian Languages.





2.6 PANDIT DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA SHODHPEETH

The University also holds the distinction of being a pioneer in establishing Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Shodhpeeth. The State Government of Uttar Pradesh established the Shodhpeeth in the year 2017 at this University. The aim of this Shodhpeeth is to assimilate knowledge related to life, thought and philosophy of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay and promote dialogue and research in the area. Besides other regular research and academic activities, various seminars are organized by the Shodhpeeth from time to time, to familiarize students with the thoughts and vision of the great leader.

2.7 COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTRE

The University has entered a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with ERA University, Career Institute of Medical/Dental Sciences, IIM Road, Lucknow and Balrampur Hospital, Kaiser bagh, Lucknow. Through these MoUs, all University students, faculty and staff can access OPD, dental and hospital services at both the hospitals for a nominal fee. The hospital extends ambulance services to the University in case of emergencies. The University's Community Health Center addresses the medical requirements of both students and staff. It operates a 24-hour Outpatient Department (OPD) facility and is well- equipped to handle emergency situations. A nurse is available at the Center round the clock, while a doctor is accessible for consultation four hours each day.



2.8 NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP 2020)

Our University has implemented NEP 2020, embracing its holistic and flexible education approach with a multidisciplinary curriculum, skill-based learning, multiple entry and exit options, and a focus on research and innovation. The curriculum structure, technology integration, and multilingual education enhance learning, critical thinking, and creativity.

2.9 E-LEARNING FACILITIES

By integrating online learning with traditional teaching, Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University is fostering a dynamic and inclusive academic ecosystem that prepares students for global career opportunities and lifelong learning. **In alignment with the University Grants Commission (UGC) SWAYAM Regulations 2021, the University has adopted a progressive approach that allows students to enroll in Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) through SWAYAM-NPTEL, and other recognized platforms.**

Further, the University has established an official SWAYAM-NPTEL Local Chapter (LC ID: 6845) to facilitate online learning and course registrations for students and faculty.

In addition to the above, a comprehensive e-content repository has been created by the faculty members and is accessible across various online platforms for student convenience. Moreover, to enhance audiovisual



learning, the University maintains an official YouTube Channel featuring over 500 video lectures prepared by faculty members covering a diverse range of subjects.



2.10 ASHFAQ ULLAH KHAN UNIVERSITY GUEST HOUSE

In addition to academic pursuits, extra-curricular activities are a common occurrence at the University, attracting participants from both domestic and national level. As hosts, the University ensures their comfortable accommodation at the Guest House, which is furnished with modern amenities.



2.11 MEDIA STUDIO

The University has inaugurated a cutting-edge Media Studio in the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication to offer hands-on training to its students. The studio have advanced equipment including high-definition indoor and outdoor cameras, a teleprompter, interactive screens and a state-of-the-art editing system. It is fully equipped to facilitate the recording of video lectures and the production of top-tier films. The studio features a dedicated audio section for voiceovers, recordings and radio training. Various workshops focusing on shooting, audio recording and editing are regularly conducted for students within the studio premises.



2.12 TRANSPORTATION FACILITY

Various modes of transportation are accessible to students for traveling between the University and the city.

2.13 RAM PRASAD BISMIL LIBRARY

The Library offers a conducive study environment for students, faculty and visitors, presenting a wealth of knowledge through its extensive collection of books and online resources. Its diverse collection covers a wide array of subjects, while also subscribing to numerous periodicals, magazines and journals to keep students informed about contemporary developments in their respective fields of study.





2.14 CHANDRASHEKHARAZAD GYMNASIUM

Recognizing that good health is essential for success, the University prioritizes the overall well-being of its staff and students. To this end, it has established a Gymnasium, offering a comprehensive range of health and recreational facilities under one roof. The gymnasium boasts state-of-the-art exercise equipment and indoor amenities such as table tennis, badminton courts and Yoga Centre fostering health awareness throughout the campus. The Gymnasium is dedicated to provide rigorous training to the University athletes and sports enthusiasts.



2.15 BASKETBALL COURT AND NET-PRACTICE FACILITY

The University also features a basketball court and a cricket net practice pitch to train students in outdoor activities and prepare them for both intra-college and inter-college competitions.



2.16 RANI LAXMI BAI GIRLS HOSTEL AND NETAJI SUBHASH CHANDRA BOSE BOYS' HOSTEL

The University is experiencing rapid expansion in both its facilities and student enrollment. It offers separate accommodation for boys and girls, with in-house mess facilities for convenient student living. The boys' hostel accommodates approximately 380 students, while the girls' hostel can house up to 300 students.



To enhance student experience, the hostels regularly organize various activities, events, and celebrations. Both hostels are equipped with complimentary Wi-Fi services, smart T.V. facility, Daily News Papers, Monthly/weekly International and National Magazine, indoor gymnasium for boys' hostel and indoor games, with CCTV cameras installed for safety and security. Room allotments adhere to the University rules, guidelines, and regulations. The hostel facility is available at an affordable cost: INR 24,700/- annually for single occupancy and INR 14,050/- with caution fee for double occupancy. Single occupancy is exclusively available for Ph.D. students. Additionally, residents are required to pay the prevailing mess charges with INR 3000/- caution money (refundable) for availing the compulsory mess facility. Washing machines have been installed in the hostels for the convenience and better hygiene of students.



2.17 AWADH INCUBATION FOUNDATION (AIF)

The Awadh Incubation Foundation (AIF) is incorporated as a Section 8 Company, guided by a competent and qualified Board of Directors. Situated at Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University, Lucknow, a state-funded institution, AIF benefits from access to the University's Wi-Fi-enabled infrastructure. This includes classrooms equipped with LCD projectors, technical laboratories, seminar halls, conference rooms, boardrooms, computer labs, libraries, cafeterias, vehicle parking and other essential facilities. AIF welcomes all students and alumni of the University, as well as individuals with business ideas ready for launch. We also extend support to aspiring start-ups and entrepreneurs in need of incubation assistance to elevate their ideas to the next level. The vision at AIF revolves around leveraging education and technology inputs, particularly those available or developed at our University, to benefit industries, agriculture, healthcare and various domains of expertise in the new century. We aim to contribute to the enhancement of the socio-economic structure of the country.

AIF offers access to office space, business advisory services and other forms of support to emerging startups, nurturing their growth until they are prepared to transition into full-fledged businesses.





2.18 WOMEN STUDY CENTRE

The Women Study Centre at the University was established on April 27, 2021, with the goal of empowering women, particularly those in rural areas, by enhancing their educational, familial, professional, social, economic, and physical well-being. The Centre regularly organizes various activities both on and off campus to promote the welfare of women. It focuses on addressing gender-related issues and challenging the persistent gender-biased practices in the social, economic, political, and cultural spheres through its initiatives.

2.19 LIFTS

To enhance facilities for differently-abled individuals, Uttar Pradesh State Construction and Labor Development Cooperative Federation Limited is constructing **one lift and seven ramps** in the academic building, and three lift are functional.



2.20 SOLAR POWER PLANT

With the objective of promoting sustainable development and the use of alternative energy, a **150-kilowatt solar power plant** has been installed on the library's rooftop. Additionally, another **150-kilowatt solar power plant** is being installed on the academic building's rooftop. In the near future a **1000-kilowatt solar power plant** will also be incorporated within the University premises.



2.21 CONSTRUCTION OF AUDITORIUM

Under the infrastructural development of the University, a 1200-seat capacity auditorium is being constructed on the campus by Uttar Pradesh Rajkiya Nirman Nigam Limited.



3. BODIES/COMMITTEES FORMULATED FOR STUDENTS SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

3.1 DEAN OF STUDENTS' WELFARE:

The Dean Student Welfare looks after the general welfare of the students and works towards their personal and professional growth. DSW conducts various activities to promote intellectual, cultural and social interaction among the students. The University aims to provide a congenial environment of learning that supports academic excellence and offers a magnitude of opportunities to the students for realizing their full potential.

3.2 STUDENTS' WELFARE FUND:

The Students' Welfare Fund is established to support students in need, ensuring their well-being and academic success. The fund is fully operational, with a structured policy in place to provide financial assistance where required. Students seeking support can visit our official website / Dean of Students' Welfare office for detailed guidelines and application procedures.

3.3 SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE:

The University has a scholarship committee that helps the students in availing benefits of U.P State Government scholarships. This scholarship is accessible to the students belonging to all categories namely SC, ST, OBC, Minority and Unreserved hailing from economically weaker sections of the society. It aims to instill confidence among these students, motivate them for higher education and bring them in the mainstream of education system. The Committee also provides assistance to the Minority students for availing the benefits of Minority Welfare Scholarship System/Scheme. Under this scheme, scholarship is provided to the meritorious students of these communities. It is aimed towards preserving their right to education, providing them with greater opportunities in higher education and enhancing their chances of employability.

The Committee also provides guidelines to the students regarding other scholarship schemes of the government.

3.4 PROCTORIAL BOARD:

The Proctorial Board of the University, comprising the Proctor, Deputy Proctors, and Assistant Proctors, is tasked with ensuring that students comply with the University's rules and regulations. It aims to foster a harmonious campus atmosphere and ensure the smooth functioning of campus activities. Additionally, the board addresses student grievances and takes proactive measures to safeguard their interests.

3.5 INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE:

Gender equality, including protection from sexual harassment at workplace and right to work with dignity is a universally recognized human right. In compliance with the instructions of National Commission for Women and guidelines issued in implementation of the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court Judgement dated 13th August, 1997 in the case of Visakha and others vs. State of Rajasthan and Others on the subject of sexual harassment of women at workplace, this University had duly constituted a Complaint Committee for considering complaints of sexual harassment of women working at University. This cell is dedicated towards creating a congenial environment in the campus where every woman feels safe and confident. The members of the cell also conduct regular meetings and organize activities to create awareness towards prevention of harassment and violence against women and gender sensitization.

3.6 STUDENTS GRIEVANCES AND REDRESSAL CELL (SGRC):



SGRC has been set up in the University as per guidelines of UGC. A lokpal has been nominated to ensure transparency, accountability, and fairness in addressing grievances. A dedicated committee oversees its functioning, ensuring impartial inquiry and resolution of complaints. Students and staff can approach the Lokpal for redressal, and detailed guidelines are available on the University website.

3.7 ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE:

Anti-Ragging Committee of the University is an advisory and supervisory body that works towards providing a ragging free environment in the campus. Its primary aim is to keep a vigil and put a tab on the incidents of ragging. The members of the committee conduct regular inspections of classrooms, canteen and other places of student assembly for any incidence of Ragging. The committee also holds orientation sessions with the students to educate them on the menace of ragging and related punishment provisions. The proctor functions as the coordinator of this committee.

3.8 GENDER SENSITIZATION COMMITTEE:

As gender sensitization is a process of behavioral change by instilling empathy into the views that people hold about their own and other sex. The constitution of India provides for equality of status and opportunity to all the citizens. It is imperative for the students to be aware of the issues related to gender.

The University has constituted a committee to sensitize all stakeholders with regards to equality in law, social system and democratic activities.

3.9 NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC):

Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University's National Cadet Corps (Girls) unit is affiliated with the 20 UP Girls Battalion NCC, Lucknow, comprising 80 girl cadets. The unit engages in various social initiatives like awareness campaigns, tree plantation drives, Mission Ganga, Nadi Utsav, Mission Shakti, and Vision Viksit Bharat. NCC training includes institutional training, physical fitness, yoga, drill, firing, map reading, and obstacle training, which shape cadets' personalities and enhance their prospects in the Armed Forces. The cadets gain invaluable practical experiences with a proper infrastructure facilities available in the campus. Even during COVID-19, they actively participated in awareness campaigns for vaccination and safety measures. NCC cadets also get the privilege to attend national camps, including the prestigious Republic Day Parade camp. NCC has its first band TIRANGA TARANGINI.



3.10 NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS):

The National Service Scheme started in the University in 2015 under the aegis of Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India with the aim to develop overall personality of the students through community service. The students enrolled under the scheme take part in community services, develop essential skills such as leadership, teamwork, and empathy while addressing social issues like education, health, and environmental sustainability. It promotes national integration, bridges the gap between students and diverse communities, and nurtures a sense of responsibility and empathy toward society. Ultimately, NSS helps students grow holistically, preparing them to become responsible citizens and contributing positively to the nation's development. Presently, the University has 8 Units of NSS.



3.11 ROVERS-RANGERS :

In the previous academic year, KMCLU added another feather to its cap as it proudly established its first Rovers and Rangers unit in the University. With the aim of holistic development and spiritual growth, KMCLU is relentlessly striving to hone the skills and talents of students in producing the leaders of the future. An orientation programme was organized to familiarize students with its numerous activities and opportunities.



3.12 CULTURAL COMMITTEE:

The Cultural Committee works for interpersonal learning of various arts and creative skills by conducting various events and activities. The Cultural Committee shall be responsible for all intra and inter collegiate cultural events in the University. The Committee makes plan and schedule of all the cultural events for the academic year. Events like COSAC and foundation day are celebrated every year in October. Various other occasions as Abul Kalam Azad Jayanti, Atal Bihari Bajpayee Jayanti, Sardar Vallabh Bhai Jayanti, Valmiki Jayanti, Gandhi Jayanti, National festivals are celebrated with great zeal and enthusiasm.

3.13 TRAINING AND PLACEMENT CELL:

In the present contemporary and competitive environment, education is not only a mode of transmitting knowledge but also a tool that equips the students with requisite professional skills that prepare them for the upcoming job opportunities. The Placement Cell of the University helps the students to identify organizations suited for training and future placement. It is dedicated to support the students in their pursuit to get jobs in various reputed organizations. In addition to this, the placement cell also conducts special lectures and workshops to update the students on current job opportunities and trends in their chosen area of study. 3.14 MUSEUM:

The museum's primary objective is to preserve historical objects and cultural heritage while promoting knowledge and education.

It supports research and facilitates the study of human history through a diverse collection of artifacts, including ancient coins, manuscripts, sculptures, weapons, and paintings.

The museum also displays images of renowned monuments such as Sanchi, Sarnath, Brihadeshwar, and Konark, along with ancient cave art from Ajanta and Ellora. These visual representations inspire students by highlighting great historical figures and presenting insights from eminent historians. Through the preservation and presentation of these invaluable treasures, the museum fosters a deeper appreciation of our rich cultural and historical legacy.



3.15 MOOT COURT:

The Faculty of Legal Studies is equipped with the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Memorial Moot Court Hall, providing a dedicated platform for practical legal training. The Department organizes moot court exercises, seminars, and skill-based workshops to strengthen advocacy, legal drafting, and research skills. As a compulsory component of the B.A. LL.B. and LL.B. curriculum, moot court practice enables students to gain hands-on experience in courtroom procedures, legal reasoning, and professional ethics, thereby effectively bridging theoretical knowledge with practical application.



3.16 GREENHOUSE FACILITY:

The University has established a well-equipped Greenhouse as an important part of its academic and research infrastructure. The greenhouse is designed to provide a controlled environment for the cultivation, conservation, and experimental study of plants. It supports teaching, research, and practical training in disciplines such as Botany, Zoology, Environmental Science, Agriculture, Biotechnology, and allied life sciences.



Aim:

The primary aim of the greenhouse is to facilitate plant research, experimental learning, and conservation of plant species under regulated temperature, humidity, and light conditions. It also aims to promote sustainable practices and environmental awareness among students.



3.17 HERBAL GARDEN FACILITY:

The University has established a well-maintained Herbal Garden as an integral component of its academic and ecological infrastructure.

The garden houses a wide variety of medicinal and aromatic plants commonly used in traditional healthcare systems and modern herbal research.

It serves as a living laboratory for students and researchers of Life Sciences, Environmental Studies, Pharmacy, and allied disciplines.

All plants across the University campus, including the Herbal Garden, have been scientifically identified and bar-coded,

Aim:

The primary aim of the Herbal Garden is to promote conservation, cultivation, and scientific understanding of medicinal plants, while preserving traditional knowledge and supporting academic teaching and research activities.



3.18 YOGA VATIKA (Yoga Garden):

The University has established a dedicated Yoga Vatika as part of its wellness-oriented and holistic infrastructure. The Yoga Vatika provides a serene, green, and pollution-free environment for the regular practice of Yoga, Pranayama, Meditation, and physical wellness activities for students, faculty, and staff.

Aim:

The primary aim of the Yoga Vatika is to promote physical fitness, mental well-being, stress management, and holistic health, while encouraging a disciplined and balanced lifestyle in the University community.



Installation of Surya Namaskar statues is planned to demonstrate correct postures and to promote awareness of traditional Indian yogic practices.

3.19 RAINWATER HARVESTING SYSTEM:

The University has established a scientifically designed Rainwater Harvesting System as an integral part of its sustainable and eco-friendly infrastructure. The system is developed to collect, channel, and store rainwater from rooftops and paved areas, ensuring its effective utilization and groundwater recharge within the campus.

The primary aim of the rainwater harvesting system is to promote water conservation, sustainable water management, and environmental responsibility, while reducing dependence on external water sources.

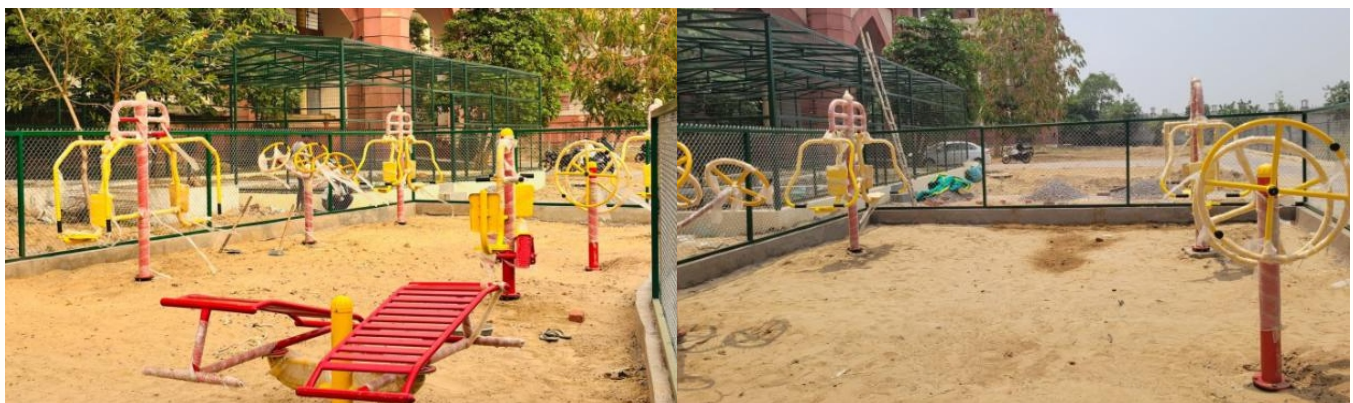


3.20 OPEN GYM FACILITY:

3.22 ART GALLERY :

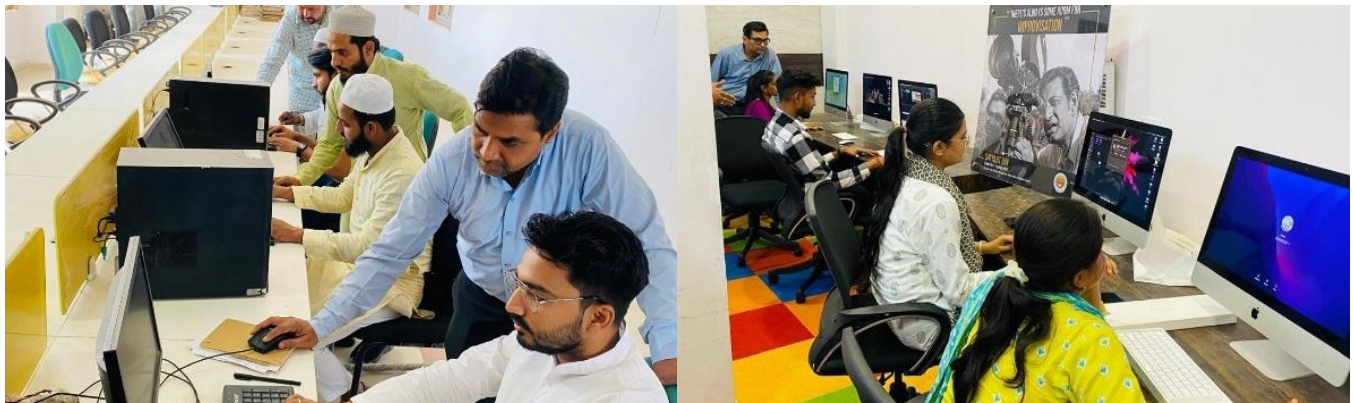
The gallery showcases a diverse range of artworks including paintings, sketches, sculptures, crafts, installations, and mixed-media creations prepared by students and faculty members.

1. GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION (2026-27)

- 1.1 Candidates are required to read the Prospectus carefully before filling in the Application Form for admission to the programmes of study offered at Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University. Candidates not complying with the instructions shall be summarily disqualified.
- 1.2 The Prospectus provides general information and is subject to the provisions of the Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and relevant Resolutions of the University.
- 1.3 Admission to all Programmes shall be subject to the provision of the Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and the relevant Resolutions of the University.
- 1.4 As per the approval of the Executive Council, all Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Diploma Programmes of the University will be run with a minimum enrollment of 10 students under each Programme.
- 1.5 If a candidate fails to complete the admission formalities by the prescribed date, his/her claim for admission will be automatically forfeited.
- 1.6 The admission of a candidate will not be completed unless he/she deposits the fee within the stipulated time as fixed by the University.
- 1.7 No candidate will be allowed to take up a job while pursuing a full-time programme. Those who are employed at the time of admission will be required to produce a certificate of leave from their employer within one month from the date of admission, failing which their admission may be cancelled.
- 1.8 No candidate, pursuing a regular full-time programme in University will be allowed to take up any other regular examination except for Diploma Programmes.
- 1.9 The University reserves the right to make any change/modification in the provisions made in this Prospectus and the same shall be duly notified on the University website. The candidates shall not be informed of any such change individually.
- 1.10 The candidates, who have appeared at the qualifying examination but whose results have not been declared, may also apply for admission. They must, however, submit their results/mark-sheets by the last date of admission as per the list in which their names appear. Any subsequent production of result/certificate of the qualifying examination shall not be considered.
- 1.11 No candidate shall be entitled to claim admission as a matter of right.
- 1.12 Request for relaxation in gap years after qualifying examinations may be considered by the Admission Committee.
- 1.13 Admission of a candidate may be cancelled at any time, if any information furnished by the candidate at the time of admission is found to be incorrect or if the candidate has been wrongly admitted due to any reason. A legal action will also be initiated against the student found guilty of submitting forged or incorrect documents under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS).
- 1.14 Ragging in the University is an offence prohibited as per the directives issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. Strict action will be taken against the students found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging. The candidates admitted to various programmes in the University shall be liable to submit an undertaking assuring not to indulge in any form of ragging. Action will be taken against the students who are involved in any kind of ragging as per the rules.
- 1.15 Candidates should apply for admission- 2026 through the online mode only. The Application Form in any other mode shall not be accepted.
- 1.16 Submission of the Application Form should be made by the candidate online through the University website: <https://kmcluadm.samarth.edu.in/>



- 1.17 All disputes regarding the admission shall be referred to the Admission Committee / Vice Chancellor of the University and their decision shall be final and binding.
- 1.18 All legal matters pertaining to the admission shall be subject to Lucknow Jurisdiction only.
- 1.19 The University reserves the right to cancel any admission at any stage.

3. IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR FILLING THE APPLICATION FORM

- 3.1 Before starting to fill the application form candidates are advised to read the Prospectus displayed on the website of the University and be clear about the programmes offered by the University, seats available, eligibility as regards age, passing/appearing in qualifying exam, minimum marks in the qualifying exam, relaxation thereof, reservation, admission procedure, subject to be chosen from list of Programmes etc. available at <https://kmcluadm.samarth.edu.in/>.
- 3.2 Students must submit self-attested photocopies of the required documents along with the Application Form. The original Migration/Transfer Certificate should be submitted at the time of counseling.
- 3.3 It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to ensure his/her eligibility before applying for admission to a particular programme. No claim of any sort in this matter shall be entertained by the University after the submission of the Form.



- 3.4 Payment of fee will be done in online mode only.
 - 3.5 The Application Fee is non-refundable and no correspondence in this respect will be entertained.
 - 3.6 Register for the Online Application Form and note down the system-generated Application Number. The candidate should supply the required details while filling the Online Application Form and is also required to create a PASSWORD. After successful submission of the personal details, an application number will be generated and it will be used to complete the remaining steps of the Application Form and will also be required for all future reference/correspondence.
 - 3.7 The Candidates can log in with the id and password for completing the Application Form including filling up personal details, educational qualification, programme selection and uploading the images and documents (if any).
 - 3.8 Upload scanned images of the candidate's photograph, signature and relevant certificates for reserved categories (SC, ST, OBC, EWS and Physically Challenged Person), and any other applicable categories to avail benefits in the admission process. Ensure that the scanned copies are clear, legible, and in the prescribed format to avoid any discrepancies.
 - 3.9 The candidate will have to upload his/her recent photograph in JPG/JPEG format. The recent photograph should be either in colour or black and white with 80% face (without mask) visible.
 - 3.10 The size of the scanned photograph should be (clearly visible) within the size limit (upto 1MB).
 - 3.11 The candidate is required to upload his/her scanned copy of signature. The scanned signature should be in JPG/JPEG format (clearly legible) within the size as prescribed. The name of these files (photograph and signature) should be appropriate.
 - 3.12 The candidate has to upload the scanned copy of certificate of reserved categories. The scanned copy of these certificates (if applicable) should be named very appropriately in the required format.
 - 3.13 Please check your photograph and signature before submission of the Application Form. In case the photograph or signature is blurred or not visible to identify the identity of the candidate then, the application will be rejected and no option for correction or revision shall be permitted.
- Note:** The Candidate has to upload only his/her own photograph, signature, and other certificates wherever applicable, as mentioned above (and not of anybody else) in a correct/proper manner. In case, it is found at any time in the future that the candidate has used/uploaded the photograph, signature, and certificate(s) of someone else in his/her Application Form, or he/she has tampered with his/her Admit Card, these acts of the candidate shall be treated under Unfair Means (UFM) Practices and actions would be taken as per the provisions relating to Unfair Means Practices.
- 3.14 After completing online application form, the candidates have to pay the requisite registration fee. The fee can be submitted only online through Net Banking, Credit Card, Debit Card, or UPI. Processing charges and GST as applicable are chargeable to the candidate (in addition to the examination fee) by the concerned Bank/Payment Gateway Integrator.
 - 3.15 The Confirmation Page of the online Application Form will be generated only after successful payment by the Candidate. In case the Confirmation Page is not generated after payment of the fee, then the candidate may have to approach the concerned Bank/Payment Gateway (in the helpline number) to ensure the successful payment or to obtain the refund of duplicate/multiple payments.
- Note:** No request for refund of fee once remitted by the candidate will be entertained by University under any circumstances.
- 3.16 Download, save and print a copy of the Application Form (which would be downloadable only after the successful remittance of the fee) for future reference.



GENERAL INSTRUCTION TO THE CANDIDATE:

- 3.17 Candidate shall ensure that the information entered by them in their respective online Application Form is correct.
- 3.18 Information provided by the candidates in their respective online Application Forms, like the Name of the Candidate, Contact Details, Address Details, Category, Gender, Educational Qualification Details, Date of Birth etc. will be treated as final. Any request for change in such particulars will not be considered by University under any circumstances.
- 3.19 All candidates must ensure that they have provided the correct e-mail address and mobile number.
- 3.20 Candidates must ensure that their email address and mobile number to be registered in their online Application Form are their own, as relevant/important information/ communication will be sent by the University through e-mail on the registered mail address and/or through SMS on the registered mobile number only. The University shall not be responsible for any non- communication /miscommunication with a candidate in the email address or mobile number given by him/her other than his/her own. All Candidates shall ensure that the information (like his/her name, mother's name, father's name, gender, date of birth, category, mobile number, e-mail address, photograph and signature etc.) provided by them in their online Application Form is correct and is their own.
- 3.21 The University does not edit/modify/alter any information entered by the candidates after completion of the application process under any circumstances. Any request for change in information thereafter will not be entertained. Therefore, candidates are advised to exercise utmost caution before filling up the correct details in the Application Form.
- 3.22 Candidates are advised to visit the website of the University (<https://kmclu.ac.in>) and check their e-mails regularly for the latest updates.
- 3.23 Candidates are advised to fill out only one Application Form and to take utmost care while filling out the mobile number and e-mail address. Candidates are also advised to use the mobile number and email address that is accessible to them (may be parent/ guardian). One mobile number and email address can be used for one Application Form only.
- 3.24 Mere appearance in the Entrance Test does not entitle a candidate to be considered for admission to the Programme unless he/she fulfills the Programme-wise eligibility conditions of the University they are applying to.
- 3.25 The examination may be held on multiple shifts, depending on the number of candidates and their combinations.
- 3.26 The allotment of candidates to the shift will be based on the options exercised and technical and administrative considerations.
- 3.27 Admit Cards will be issued for the course(s) opted by him/her. No request for a change of date or shift will be entertained.
- 3.28 Candidates have to report for the slot/s as per the time stated in their respective Admit Cards.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CANDIDATES APPEARING IN WRITTEN TEST

- 3.29 Candidates are advised to report at the Examination Center well in time i.e. 1 hour before the commencement of the examination.
- 3.30 Candidates should take their seats immediately after the opening of the Examination Hall. If the candidates do not report in time due to any reason i.e. traffic jam, train/bus delay, etc. they are likely to miss some of the important instructions to be announced in the Examination Rooms/Halls. The University shall not be responsible for any delay.



- 3.31 The candidate must show, on-demand, the Admit Card downloaded/printed from the University website for admission in the examination room/hall. The Centre Staff on duty is authorized to verify the identity of candidates and may take steps to verify and confirm the identity credentials. A candidate who does not possess a valid Admit Card and authorized Photo ID shall not be permitted to take the examination under any circumstances by the Centre Superintendent.
- 3.32 A seat indicating Roll Number will be allotted to each candidate. Candidates should find and sit in their allocated seats only. In case a candidate ventures to change his/her seat and does not sit on the seat allotted to him/her could face cancellation of candidature. No plea would be entertained in this regard.
- 3.33 The candidate should ensure that the Question Paper available is as per his/her opted subject indicated in the Admit Card. In case, the subject of the Question Paper is other than his/her opted subject, the same may be brought to the notice of the Invigilator concerned immediately.
- 3.34 The candidates may approach the Centre Superintendent/Invigilator in the room for any technical assistance, first aid emergency, or any other information during the course of the examination. For any queries or issues regarding the Test, the candidates may contact on Helpline Numbers available on the University website.
- 3.35 In case a candidate, by furnishing false information, his / her candidature will be cancelled and his / her result will not be declared.
- 3.36 The applicants to all Programmes offered by the University under 'Reservation of Seats' or applicants claiming benefit under 'Special Provision for Admission' must attach self-attested photocopies of the certificate of the Reserved/Special category issued by a competent authority, along with their Application Forms/ Registration at the time of counseling.

4. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 4.1 Admission to all Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes offered by the University will be based on merit and entrance test scores as mentioned in the table, and will be granted based on the qualifying examination.
- 4.2 The Merit for students applying to Undergraduate, Postgraduate and other Programmes will be determined as under:
 - For Session 2026-27, the Undergraduate and Postgraduate students shall be admitted based on the total marks secured in the qualifying examinations.
 - If two or more candidates secure equal marks in the merit list/qualifying examination, the older one among the candidates will be given a preference.
- 4.3 **Students who have qualified any national or state level entrance examination, shall be exempted from the University entrance test.**

5. ADMISSION OF FOREIGN NATIONAL/NRI STUDENTS

- 5.1 Admission to foreign students will be given as per guidelines available on University website as per UGC/Indian/State Government Rules.
- 5.2 Foreign/NRI students can take admission in any subject of their choice being offered by the University.
- 5.3 Eligibility qualifications for foreign students will be the same as for Indian students for each programme mentioned in the Prospectus of the University.
- 5.4 Only those students who have qualified from Foreign Universities or Boards of Higher Education, recognized equivalent by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) are eligible for admission.



- 5.5 On being granted admission, all applicants should produce their Visa related documents within one month of completion of admission formalities.
- 5.6 For programmes governed by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE)/University, the regulations applicable to NRI (Non-Resident Indian) and Foreign National students shall strictly adhere to the provisions outlined in the Annual Process Handbook/University admission guidelines. Any issues related to admission, fee structure, eligibility criterion etc. for such students will be governed by the latest guidelines specified in the handbook. The University shall ensure full compliance with these regulations, and any updates or modifications issued by AICTE from time to time will be duly implemented. Students are advised to refer to the official AICTE Annual Process Handbook for comprehensive details.

Note: The admission fee of Foreign/NRI Students will be displayed on the University website.

6. COMPLETION OF ADMISSION FORMALITIES

- 6.1 The selected applicants must complete their admission formalities as per the Admission Schedule.
- 6.2 At the time of admission, the applicants shall be required to produce the following documents in original with one set of self-attested photocopies of the same, failing which their admission is liable to be cancelled.

OUTSTANDING SPORTS PERSON

Seats under various Programmes of the University shall be reserved or special provisions be made for Outstanding Sports persons. The weightage will be given to the players who have represented Uttar Pradesh in National, Inter-state or Inter-regional competitions in last two years and the competitions have been organized by State Sports Organizations recognized by the Competent Authorities. The procedure adopted for the purpose of admission may be as per the details given below or as may be decided by the Academic Council/U.P. Government from time to time.

- Weightage to the extent of 5% of marks in aggregate or in the subject concerned, as the case may be, will be given to such candidates.
- An additional seat may be created for such students over and above the seats allotted to each Programme on the recommendation of the Games and Sports Committee subject to the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
- All the Sports persons selected for admission under sports quota shall have to give an affidavit of consent for conducting/participating in practice/representing the University team on being selected to do so, before they are admitted.
- To claim the sports weightage, the candidate will have to present himself before the Sports Committee for a trial.
- Department of Physical Education may be contacted for any admission related queries under this Category.

N.C.C.

Weightage to the extent of 2.5% marks in aggregate or in the subject concerned, as the case may be, will be given to cadet shaving the following N.C.C. Certificates for admission to all programmes.

- "A" or "B" Certificate for admission to Undergraduate programmes.
- "C" Certificate for admission to Postgraduate programmes.

N.S.S.

Students possessing a National Service Scheme (NSS) Certificate, in accordance with the norms set by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, will be awarded a 2% weightage in the aggregate marks or in the relevant subject, as applicable, for admission to all programmes.

Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandits/Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants)

Incompliance to the directions of Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, the University Has special provision for Kashmiri Migrants. However, they must apply and go through the entire admission process to be eligible for the following reservations/relaxations.



- Their may be permitted are relaxation in cut off percentage to the extent of 10% of marks subject to the fulfillment of minimum eligibility requirement of the programme applied for.
- Their admission will be considered over and above, not exceeding 5% of the total seats in the programme applied for.
- Further, a reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional programmes shall be granted to such candidates.
- Candidates seeking admission under this category will not be required to submit domicile certificate. However, they will have to submit a certificate in support of their claim of being Kashmiri migrants obtainable from the concerned authorities.

ATTENDANCE

Subject to the Uttar Pradesh State Universities Act-1973 (As Amended) Subsection 2(c) of Section 51 and the First Statutes of the University, attendance for the regular students shall be governed as per the following provisions:

- In order to be eligible to appear at the Semester End Examination, a student shall be deemed to have undergone a regular Programme of study in the University if he/she has attended at least 75% lectures/tutorials and separately 75% practical/field work teaching practice and such other activities as decided by the Academic Council from time to time.
- Provided further that a relaxation to the maximum extent of 15% of the total attendance may be accorded to a student on account of serious sickness/excruciating medical disability, participation in the University-approved co-curricular/extra-curricular activities and prescribed educational/cultural tours.
- Provided further that in case of medical disability as mentioned here in above, an application for condonation shall be supported by a medical certificate advising such a condonation issued by a Public Hospital or such hospitals as notified by the University. Such applications must be submitted either during the period of treatment/hospitalization or within 15 days following recovery.

GENERAL RULES REGARDING ADMISSION/CANCELLATION/FEE REFUND

- 1.1 The fee mentioned in the Prospectus is only for the current academic year and may be changed in the next academic year.
- 1.2 If a student requests through proper channel to cancel his/her admission for any valid reason, the fee will be refunded as per the University norms. All charges except admission and enrollment fee will be refunded only if the admission is cancelled within one month or till the last date of admission, whichever is earlier. In other cases, no fee except caution money will be refunded in any circumstances and no correspondence in this regard will be entertained.
- 1.3 In addition to the provisions mentioned above, if the State Government or the University Grants Commission (UGC) issues any guidelines regarding fee refunds, the University will give utmost priority to those directives and implement them accordingly. Such guidelines will take precedence over any existing institutional policies on fee refunds to ensure full compliance with regulatory authorities.
- 1.4 If a student does not claim the refund of his/her credit balance within one year of leaving the University, the amount standing to his/her credit shall be forfeited.
- 1.5 The caution money of a regular student will be refunded only after the declaration of the final



examination results. If it remains unclaimed for more than three year from the date of announcement of the result, it shall not be refunded. Unclaimed caution money after the stipulated period will be utilized for the benefit of the University.

1.6 Students admitted to the Diploma Programmes in addition to full-time programme of the University shall be charged the following fees:

Under this policy, donors or benefactors University awards, medals, or scholarships in the name of distinguished individuals.
