The orientation programme for the session 2025-26 was inaugurated with the welcome address by the Head of the Department of English & M.E.A.L., Prof. Tanveer Khadija. Accompanied by a vibrant PPT, Prof. Khadija's welcome address helped break the ice between students and faculty members. Along with the syllabus and examination pattern, the students were introduced to the Department and informed about the various curricular and extra-curricular activities that they would get a chance to participate in during the coming years. On Day Two (29.07.25), Mr. Yusuf Ayaz, Assistant Professor (T), delivered a lecture on "English and Employability: Explore Career Options in Related Fields." He started off by explaining the larger significance of literary studies as a discipline before venturing into a discussion on the possible job opportunities that are open to students of the Department of English & M.E.A.L., KMC Language University, Lucknow. On Day Three (30.07.25), Ms. Shikha Singh, Assistant Professor (T), delivered a lecture on "NEP 2020: An Overview of the Course Structure and Prescribed Syllabus," that introduced students to the fundamental principles of the National Education Policy, 2020, and the resulting syllabus and course structure modelled after the proposed guidelines. On Day Three (31.07.25) of the Induction Programme, Dr. Shipra Singh, Assistant Professor (T), spoke, at length, about the relevance of studying French as a language and the literary tradition associated with it. She also discussed the job opportunities related to the French curriculum. On Day Five (1.08.25), Ms. Sadaf Fatima, Assistant Professor (T), delivered an exciting lecture on the "Relevance of Extra-Curricular Activities in Personality Development," discussing theatre performances, academic competitions, conferences, workshops, and other activities. On the last day of the Orientation Programme (2.08.25), Dr. Haroon Rasheed, Assistant Professor, tied it all
