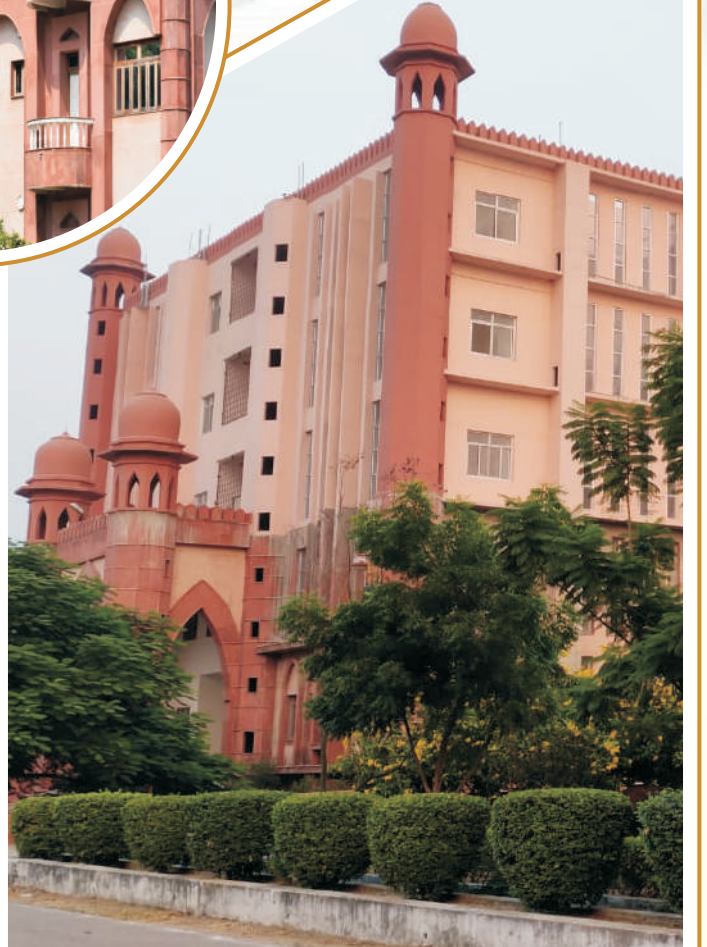

## 1. ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Language establishes identity of a nation. Language is also the means of identification, creation, preservation and extension of knowledge. It helps individuals and communities to connect with the world. As a subject, Language attracts many scholars and thinkers to explore its various unexplored dimensions. Many efforts are being made by the government to connect language with the country's heritage and also promote quality research in the area. The National Education Policy (NEP 2020) also emphasizes on promoting multilingualism and using the power of language in teaching and learning. Supporting these initiatives, the University too is attempting to contribute extensively towards promotion of languages.

Established under the Uttar Pradesh Arabi Farsi Universities Act 2009 (U.P. Act No. 12 of 2009), the University got its name as 'Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Urdu, Arabi-Farsi University' by an Amendment in the year 2012 in the name of well acclaimed Sufi Saint Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti of Ajmer whose simplicity and generosity have inspired people across the globe. It also holds the status of 12B and 2f of University Grants Commission. In the month of February, 2020, the Cabinet of State Government passed the proposal to rename the University as 'Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University.'

Situated on Sitapur-Hardoi Bypass Road, the University aims to equip its students with quality education along with a deep understanding of the cultural fabric of the country and inspires them to contribute progressively towards building a knowledge society.

The University started its first academic session in August 2013 with students pursuing studies in Urdu, Arabic, Persian, English, Hindi, Geography, History, Economics, Home-Science, Physical Education, Political Science, Education, Commerce, Computer Science, Business Administration and Journalism and Mass Communication under its Graduate and Postgraduate Programmes. Apart from these, Diploma Programmes have also been a popular option among students enrolling in the University. At present this strength has gone upto 4256 and number of Programmes offered by this university has also increased significantly.

Since its inception the University has grown considerably in its scale and scope. It now offers a plethora of learning opportunities to the students from within and outside the state and with a rich blend of professionalism and tradition, this University has already established a niche in the academic circle of Uttar Pradesh.

Professional Programmes such as Engineering and Technology have always been popular among the students. Therefore, the University has also introduced AICTE approved B. Tech. Programme in Civil





Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Computer Science and Computer Science and Engineering with Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning in the University since 2019. The University has also launched L.L.M. Programme under the faculty of legal studies from academic year 2021-22 and M. Tech Programme under the Faculty of Engineering and Technology. The University is constantly making new endeavors to establish its identity as a Language University. Thus, apart from offering Programmes in Hindi, English, French, Sanskrit, Urdu, Arabic and Persian the University is also in the process of introducing specialized Programmes in other Indian and Foreign Languages to help the students learn a new language in addition to their regular academic Programmes. University has also decided to offer Programmes pertaining to History and Culture of Language. In addition, Value Added Courses have been initiated by almost every department of the university to match the expectations of NEP2020 guidelines. Looking at the importance of sports and physical activities along with studies, the University offers curriculum for Physical Education at Undergraduate level and sports events are organized in the University campus on a regular basis.

Besides taking care of physical security, efforts have been made to secure the premises digitally and for this purpose CCTV cameras have been installed throughout the campus. The University also provides free Wi-Fi facility to all students, faculty members and non-teaching staff.

## INFRASTRUCTURE & SERVICES

The University has in its offering several infrastructural amenities to cater to the academic needs of the students.

### ACADEMIC BUILDING

The Academic Building of the University boasts of air conditioned, projector assisted classrooms for audio-visual teaching and learning as well as an auditorium, faculty rooms for teachers and seminar/conference halls for debates, discussions and other academic activities.

### LABS

For the convenience of the students and the teachers, each floor of the academic building has a separate reading room to provide a congenial environment of learning for the students and scholars.

The Department of Computer Science maintains an internet supported Computer Lab which can be used by the faculty members and students for research and academic purposes. All other Departments have also been equipped with computer labs to make the students adept at using ICT in their respective subjects. The labs and workshops of Chemistry, Physics, Electrical, Electronics, Biotechnology, Civil and Mechanical as well as Media Lab also working properly.

In order to enhance language proficiency of the students as per global standards, the University has set up state-of-the-art language labs. The Departments of Arabic, Persian, English and Urdu have their own language labs where students are trained to hone up their skills of language proficiency.





## ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING

The beautiful Administrative Building of the University is a landmark that greets all students and visitors as they enter the University campus. This Block buzzes with activity throughout the day catering to a diverse range of student affairs and financial activities. The office of the Vice Chancellor, Finance Officer, Controller of Examinations and Registrar are also located in this building.



## VIDEO CONFERENCING HALL

One of the major attractions of this building is the multipurpose conference room equipped with latest tools of communication including facilities of video conferencing.

## STUDENTS' FACILITY CENTRE (SFC)

The SFC started functioning from the last academic session. The Centre is equipped with several student amenities like canteen, print and photocopy shop and stationary shop. A girl's common and hobby room equipped with indoor games has also been constructed in this building to provide avenues of recreation to girl students of the University. Apart from this, the building also has NCC and NSS offices which undertake several social welfare activities in and around the University.



## PANDIT DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA SHODHPEETH

The University also holds the distinction of being a pioneer in establishing Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Shodhpeeth. Uttar Pradesh State Government established the Shodhpeeth in the year 2017 at this University. The aim of this Shodhpeeth is to assimilate knowledge related to life, thought and philosophy of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay and promote dialogue and research in the area. Besides other regular research and academic activities, various seminars are organized by the Shodhpeeth from time to time, to familiarize the students with the thoughts and vision of the great leader.



## MEDICAL CENTRE

The Medical Centre of the University caters to the medical needs of students and staff. The Centre offers 24-hour OPD facility and is equipped to deal with any emergency situation. The University has also signed a MoU with Career Institute of Medical/Dental Sciences and Hospital situated at IIM road. Under this MoU, all students, teachers and employees of the University can avail OPD, Dental and Hospital facilities of Career Hospital at a nominal fee. The hospital also provides ambulance facility to the University in case of any emergency.



## E-LEARNING

The expansion of digital technologies has embodied the concept of global village. In the pandemic era terms like e-learning, virtual classrooms, web-based learning, LMS and virtual labs have become a reality.



Thus, to provide the students with seamless learning opportunities, the University has the provision to conduct both online and offline classes. A vast e-content resource has been created by the University teachers and is available on different online platforms for the ease of the students. To promote audio – visual learning, the University also has an official YouTube Channel that hosts more than 500 video lectures prepared by the teachers on a variety of subjects. For LMS, a software namely KOPAL already has been provided to their stakeholders to manage all the related activities.

## INDOOR THEATRE

For students interested in performing arts and theater there is a provision of Indoor Theater inside the Student Facility Centre (SFC) where cultural events are organized on a regular basis.

## UNIVERSITY GUEST HOUSE

Besides academic engagements, extra-curricular activities are a regular phenomenon at this University wherein guests from across the country and abroad keep taking part. As a host, the University has made provision for their comfortable stay at its Guest House which is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities.

## MEDIA STUDIO

A futuristic Media Studio has been established in the University under the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication with the aim of imparting practical training to the students of the Department. The studio is equipped with a high definition indoor outdoor camera, teleprompter, interactive screen and high end editing system. The studio is well equipped to support recordings of video lectures as well as production of high-quality films. The studio also has separate audio section for voice over, recording and radio training. Various workshops related to shooting, audio recording and editing are organized for the students in the studio.

## LIBRARY

The University library offers a congenial study environment for students, staff and visitors. It provides a wealth of knowledge through its vast collection of books and online resources. It houses a rich resource of books, relating to different subjects.

## UNIVERSITY GYMNASIUM AND CLUB

Good health is the key to a successful life. Thus, keeping in view the overall well being of its staff and students, the University has opened a Gymnasium and Club that provides a wide array of health and recreational facilities under one roof. The gymnasium offers the latest and best exercise equipment along with indoor table tennis and badminton courts aimed at promoting health awareness in the campus. Apart from this, the Gymnasium is also aimed at providing intense training to sports persons of the University.





## BASKET BALL COURT AND NET-PRACTICE FACILITY

To train the students in outdoor activities and prepare them for Intra College and Inter College competitions the University also has a Basket Ball court and a Cricket net practice pitch.

## HOSTEL FACILITY

The University has separate boys' and girls' hostels that provide convenient accommodation for the students with in house mess facility. The boys' hostel has a capacity of around 300 students, and the girls' hostel also offers an accommodation for 300 students. To make the stay of the students pleasant and enjoyable, various activities, events and celebrations are organized within the hostels on a regular basis. Both the hostels are enabled with free wi-fi services and indoor games. CCTV cameras have also been installed to maintain safety and security. The allotment of rooms is made as per the rules, guidelines and relevant regulations of the University. The Hostel facility is available at quite an affordable cost. The facility of single occupancy is available only for Ph.D. students. Besides this, students will have to pay the mess charges for availing the mess facility, that is compulsory for every resident. ## AWADH INCUBATION FOUNDATION (AIF)

Awadh Incubation Foundation is registered as a not-for-profit Section 8 Company and will be guided by well-qualified and competent Board of Directors. AIF is located at Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University, Lucknow, a state-funded University and will have access to University's Wi-Fi-enabled infrastructure like classrooms with LCD Projectors, Technical Labs, Seminar Halls, Conference Rooms, Board Rooms, Computer Labs, Library, Cafeteria, Vehicle Parking and other facilities. AIF is open to all the students and alumni of the University and anyone with business idea that is ready to launch. We also support aspiring start-ups and entrepreneurs requiring incubation support to help to take up their ideas to the next level. The vision of AIF relies on education and technology inputs especially that available or developed at our university to industry, agriculture, health and in all areas of new century expertise and to contribute towards improvement of socio-economic structure of the country.

AIF provides access to office space, business advice and other support services to new and budding start-ups, nurturing their development until they are ready to graduate to start their business.

## DEAN OF STUDENTS' WELFARE

DSW is responsible for promoting a safe and inclusive environment, fostering academic excellence, promoting campus community, and managing the university's student welfare fund. The DSW plays a crucial role in creating a positive and fulfilling experience for students at the university. They work closely with other university departments to provide a range of support services that address students' physical, emotional, and mental health needs. The DSW is also accountable for managing the university's student welfare fund, maintaining a group personal accident insurance policy and establishment of community medical centre and ensuring that resources are allocated effectively to meet the needs of students.





## WOMEN STUDY CENTRE

Women Study Centre in University is established on April 27, 2021. Women Study Centre is constantly working towards the empowerment of women, especially women in rural areas, to strengthen their educational, family, professional, social, economic and physical aspects. The activities for welfare of women are organized inside and outside the campus on regular basis from time to time. ### 2. GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION 2023-24

- 2.1 Candidates are required to read the Prospectus carefully before filling in the Application Form for admission to the programmes of study offered at Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University. The Prospectus provides general information and is subject to the provisions of the Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and relevant Resolutions of the University.
- 2.2 The University reserves the right to make any change/modification in the provisions made in this Prospectus and the same shall be duly notified on the university website. The candidates shall not be informed of any such change individually.
- 2.3 The candidates, who have appeared at the qualifying examination but whose results have not been declared, may also apply for admission. They must, however, submit their results/mark-sheets by the last date of admission as per the list in which their names appear. Any subsequent production of result/certificate of the qualifying examination shall not be considered.
- 2.4 No candidate shall be entitled to claim admission as a matter of right.
- 2.5 Request for relaxation in gap years after qualifying examinations may be considered by the Admission Committee.
- 2.6 Admission of a candidate may be cancelled at any time, if any information furnished by the candidate at the time of admission is found to be incorrect or if the candidate has been wrongly admitted due to any reason. A legal action will also be initiated against the student found guilty of submitting forged or incorrect documents under IPC.
- 2.7 Ragging in the University is an offence prohibited as per the directives issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. Strict action will be taken against the students found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging. The candidates admitted to various programmes in the University shall be liable to submit an undertaking assuring not to indulge in any form of ragging. Action will be taken against the students who are involved in any kind of ragging as per the rules.

## 4. IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR FILLING THE APPLICATION FORM

- 4.1 The candidates willing to apply for more than one Programme will have to submit separate form for each Programme of study. Application Forms shall not be transferred from one Programme of study to another.
- 4.2 Students must submit self-attested photocopies of the required documents along with the Application Form. The original Migration/Transfer Certificate should be submitted at the time of counseling.
- 4.3 It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to ensure his/her eligibility before applying for admission to a particular program. No claim of any sort in this matter shall be entertained by the University after the submission of the Form.
- 4.4 Payment of fee by cheque shall not be accepted.
- 4.5 The Application Fee is non-refundable and no correspondence in this respect will be entertained.
- 4.6 The applicants to all Programmes offered by the University under 'Reservation of Seats' or applicants claiming benefit under 'Special Provision for Admission' must attach self-attested photocopies of the certificate of the Reserved/Special category issued by a competent authority, along with their Application Forms/ Registration or at the time of counseling.

## 5. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 5.1 Admission to all Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes offered by the University will be based on merit drawn on the basis of the qualifying examination.
- 5.2 The Merit for students applying to Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes will be determined as under:
  - For Session 2023-24, the Undergraduate and Postgraduate students shall be admitted on the basis of the total marks secured in the qualifying examinations.
  - If two or more candidates secure equivalent marks/rank in the merit list, the elder one among the candidates will be given a preference.

## 6. ADMISSION OF FOREIGN/ NRI STUDENTS

- 6.1 Foreign/NRI students can take admission in any subject of their choice being offered by the University.
- 6.2 The University Prospectus, stating all admission guidelines and eligibility criteria can be accessed on the University website [www.kmclu.ac.in](http://www.kmclu.ac.in)
- 6.3 Eligibility qualifications for foreign students will be the same as for Indian students for each program mentioned in the University Prospectus.
- 6.4 Only those students who have qualified from Foreign Universities or Boards of Higher Education, recognized equivalent by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) are eligible for admission.
- 6.5 On being granted admission, all applicants (except those applying for research visa) should produce their Student Visa within one month of completion of admission formalities.
- 6.6 The Forms on which the foreign students shall apply will be the same as those for the Indian nationals. The Form can be downloaded from the website of the University. A bank draft of the prescribed fee is required to be sent with downloaded Forms along with translated and self-attested copies of required certificates, photocopies of passport and visa etc. to the office of The Registrar, Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University, Sitapur-Hardoi Bypass Road, Lucknow-226013 by the last date mentioned in the Prospectus.

Note: The admission fee of Foreign/NRI Students will be displayed on the University website before the last date of submission of Application Form.



## 7. COMPLETION OF ADMISSION FORMALITIES

- 7.1 The selected applicants must complete their admission formalities as per the Admission Schedule.
- 7.2 At the time of admission, the applicants shall be required to produce the following documents in original with one set of self-attested photocopy of the same, failing which their admission is liable to be cancelled.

1.	Marksheet and Certificate of High School/Equivalent
2.	Provisional/Original Marksheet and Certificate of Intermediate/ Equivalent Marksheet and Degree of Undergraduate course (only for PG level courses)
3.	Transfer Certificate/Migration Certificate
4.	Character Certificate from Head of the Institution last attended or Gazetted Officer.
5.	EWS (Economically Weaker Section) Certificate, Caste Certificate (SC/ST/OBC) issued by the competent authority on the basis of which the reserved seat is being claimed.
6.	Any other Certificate on the basis of which the reservation and weightage is being claimed.
7.	Prescribed Fee

**Note:** Admission shall be subject to the verification of these documents.

- 7.3 For admission to the Diploma program, the working candidate is required to submit a 'No Objection Certificate' from their present employer. Self-employed candidates shall provide authentic evidence in support of their self-employment.

## 8. RULES FOR ADMISSION

- 8.1 Admission to all Programmes shall be subject to the provision of the Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and the relevant Resolutions of the University.
- 8.2 As per the guidelines of the Executive Council, all Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Diploma Programmes of the University will be run on a minimum enrollment of 10 students under each Programme.
- 8.3 If a candidate fails to complete the admission formalities by the prescribed date, his/her claim for admission will be automatically forfeited.
- 8.4 The admission of a candidate will not be completed unless he/she deposits the fee within the stipulated time as fixed by the University.
- 8.5 No candidate will be allowed to take up a job while pursuing a full time program. Those, who are employed at the time of admission, will be required to produce a certificate of leave from their employer within one month from the date of admission, failing which their admission may be cancelled.
- 8.6 No candidate, pursuing a regular full-time program in University will be allowed to take up any other regular examination except for Diploma Programmes, either from this or any other University/Institution as determined by the rules made in this regard by the Executive Council.
- 8.7 All disputes regarding the admission shall be referred to the Admission Committee/Vice Chancellor of the University and their decision shall be final and binding.
- 8.8 All legal matters pertaining to the admission shall be subject to Lucknow Jurisdiction only.
- 8.9 University reserves the right to cancel any admission at any stage.

### 14. RESERVATION OF SEATS

- 14.1 Seats under various programmes of the University shall be reserved for certain categories of candidates belonging to reserved groups like Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Other Backward Classes and Economically Weaker Section (EWS). The procedure adopted for the purpose of admission will be as per the norms and guidelines decided by the University/State Government from time to time.
- 14.2 Candidates seeking admission under the reserved categories shall be required to fulfill the prescribed admission requirement of the program.
- 14.3 If a candidate in the reserved category qualifies for admission in the General Category he/she shall be treated as general candidate.

## 15.1 Outstanding Sportsperson

Seats under various Programmes of the University shall be reserved or special provisions be made for Outstanding Sportspersons. The weightage will be given to the players who have represented Uttar Pradesh in National, Inter-state or Inter-regional competitions in last two years and the competitions have been organized by State Sports Organizations recognized by the Competent Authorities. The procedure adopted for the purpose of admission may be as per the details given below or as may be decided by the Academic Council/U.P. Government from time to time.

- Weightage to the extent of 5% of marks in aggregate or in the subject concerned, as the case may be, will be given to such candidates.
- An additional seat may be created for such students over and above the seats allotted to each Programme on the recommendation of the Games and Sports Committee subject to the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
- All the Sportspersons selected for admission under sports quota shall have to give an affidavit of consent for conducting/participating in practice/representing the University team on being selected to do so, before they are admitted.
- To claim the sports weightage, the candidate will have to present himself before the Sports Committee for a trial.
- Department of Physical Education may be contacted for any admission related queries under this Category.

Weightage to the extent of 2.5% marks in aggregate or in the subject concerned, as the case may be, will be given to cadets having the following N.C.C. Certificates for admission to all programmes.

- "A" or "B" Certificate for admission to Undergraduate programmes.
- "C" Certificate for admission to Postgraduate programmes.

## 15.3 N.S.S.

N.S.S. Volunteers, who have attended a minimum of two, 7 days and 10 Days Special Camps may be provided a weightage of 2% marks in aggregate or in the subject concerned as the case may be, for admission to all programmes.

## 15.4 Kashmiri Migrants

In compliance to the directions of Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, the University has special provisions for Kashmiri Migrants. However, they must apply and go through the entire admission process to be eligible for the following reservation/relaxation.

- They may be permitted a relaxation in cut off percentage to the extent of 10% of marks subject to the fulfillment of minimum eligibility requirement of the programme applied for.
- Their admission will be considered over and above, not exceeding 5% of the total seats in the programme applied for.
- Candidates seeking admission under this category will not be required to submit domicile certificate. However, they will have to submit a certificate in support of their claim of being Kashmiri migrants obtainable from the concerned authorities.

## 16. ATTENDANCE

Subject to the Uttar Pradesh State Universities Act-1973 (As Amended) Sub section 2(c) of Section 51 and the First Statutes of the University, attendance for the regular students shall be governed as





per the following provisions:

- 16.1 In order to be eligible to appear at the Semester End Examination, a student shall be deemed to have undergone a regular Programme of study in the University, if he/she has attended at least 75% lectures/tutorials and separately 75% practical/field work teaching practice and such other activities as decided by the Academic Council from time to time.
- 16.2 Provided further that a relaxation to the maximum extent of 15% of the total attendance may be accorded to a student on account of serious sickness/excruciating medical disability, participation in the University-approved co-curricular/extra-curricular activities and prescribed educational/cultural tours.
- 16.3 Provided further that in case of medical disability as mentioned herein above, an application for condonation shall be supported by a medical certificate advising such a condonation issued by a Public Hospital or such hospitals as notified by the University. Such applications must be submitted either during the period of treatment/hospitalization or within 15 days following recovery.

## **17. GENERAL RULES REGARDING ADMISSION/CANCELLATION/FEE REFUND**

- 17.1 The fee has been mentioned in the Prospectus is only for the current academic year and may be changed in the next academic year.
- 17.2 If a student requests through proper channel to cancel his/her admission for any valid reason, the fee will be refunded as per the University norms. All charges except admission and enrollment fee will be refunded only if the admission is cancelled within one month or till the last date of admission, whichever is earlier. In other cases, no fee except caution money will be refunded in any circumstances and no correspondence in this regard will be entertained.
- 17.3 If a student does not claim the refund of his/her credit balance within one year of leaving the University, the amount standing to his/her credit shall be forfeited.
- 17.4 The Caution Money of a regular student will be refunded only after the declaration of the final examination results. If it remains unclaimed for more than one year from the date of announcement of the result, it shall not be refunded.
- 17.5 Students admitted to the Diploma Programmes in addition to full-time programme of the University shall be charged the following fees:
  - Tuition Fee
  - Admission Fee
  - Examination Fee
  - Development Fee

## **18. BODIES/ COMMITTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY**

### **18.1 INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)**

The best path towards success is regular self-monitoring and upgradation. Thus, in pursuance of the recommendations of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), the University has established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The Cell regularly accesses the academic facilities and suggests measures to upgrade the quality of overall performance of the University. The Cell comprises of different committees to assess, monitor and advise on the best practices to improve and enhance the overall functioning of the University. It is committed towards enabling this University to achieve academic excellence.



## 18.2 PROCTORIAL BOARD

The Proctorial Board of the University headed by Proctor and supported by Assistant Proctors, ensures that the students of the University abide by the rules and regulations framed by the University. It works towards maintaining a harmonious atmosphere in the campus and ensures smooth functioning of the campus activities. The board also resolves student's grievances and works progressively towards safeguarding their interest.

## 18.3 INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

Gender equality, including protection from sexual harassment at workplace and right to work with dignity is a universally recognized human right. In compliance with the instructions of National Commission for Women and guidelines issued in implementation of the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court Judgement dated 13th August, 1997 in the case of Visakha and others vs. State of Rajasthan and Others on the subject of sexual harassment of women at workplace, this University had duly constituted a Complaint Committee for considering complaints of sexual harassment of women working at University. This cell is dedicated towards creating a congenial environment in the campus where every woman feels safe and confident. The members of the cell also conduct regular meetings and organize activities to create awareness towards prevention of harassment and violence against women and gender sensitization.

## 18.4 ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Anti-Ragging Committee of the University is an advisory and supervisory body that works towards providing a ragging free environment in the campus. Its primary aim is to keep a vigil and put a tab on the incidents of ragging. The members of the committee conduct regular inspections of classrooms, canteen and other places of student assembly for any incidence of Ragging. The committee also holds orientation sessions with the students to educate them on the menace of ragging and related punishment provisions. The proctor functions as the coordinator of this committee.

## 18.5 GENDER SENSITIZATION COMMITTEE

As gender sensitization is a process of behavioral change by instilling empathy into the views that people hold about their own and other sex. The constitution of India provides for equality of status and opportunity to all the citizens. It is imperative for the students to be aware of the issues related to gender. The university has constituted a committee to sensitize all stakeholders with regards to equality in law, social system and democratic activities.

## 18.6 NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi, India. It is open to school and college students on voluntary basis as a Tri-Services Organization, comprising the Army, the Navy and the Air Wing, engaged in developing the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The soldier youth foundation in India is a voluntary organization which recruits cadets from high schools, higher secondary, colleges and universities all over India. The Cadets are given basic military training in small arms and drill. The University has a unit of girls' battalion comprising on 80 female students.

## 18.7 NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The National Service Scheme has been initiated in the University with the aim to develop overall personality of the students through community service. The students enrolled under the scheme take part in a variety of developmental activities like tree plantation, creating awareness among students on relevant social issues, conducting cleanliness drives and several other activities aiming towards the



betterment of the community. The ultimate goal of the scheme is to inculcate and strengthen the feelings of patriotism, national integration, brotherhood and communal harmony among the volunteers and through them, in the society. Presently, the University has five separate NSS units.

### **18.8 ROVERS-RANGERS**

In the previous academic year, KMCLU added another feather to its cap as it proudly established its first Rovers and Rangers unit in the university. With the aim of holistic development and spiritual growth, KMCLU is relentlessly striving to hone the skills and talents of students in producing the leaders of the future. An orientation programme was organized to familiarize students with its numerous activities and opportunities.

### **18.9 SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE**

The University has a scholarship committee that helps the students in availing benefits of U.P State Government scholarships. This scholarship is accessible to the students belonging to all categories namely SC, ST, OBC, Minority and Unreserved hailing from economically weaker sections of the society. It aims to instill confidence among these students, motivate them for higher education and bring them in the mainstream of education system.

The Committee also provides assistance to the Minority students for availing the benefits of Minority Welfare Scholarship System/Scheme. Under this scheme, scholarship is provided to the meritorious students of these communities. It is aimed towards preserving their right to education, providing them with greater opportunities in higher education and enhancing their chances of employability.

The Committee also provides guidelines to the students regarding other scholarship schemes of the government.

### **18.10 CULTURAL COMMITTEE**

The Cultural Committee works for interpersonal learning of various arts and creative skills by conducting various events and activities. The Cultural Committee shall be responsible for all intra and inter collegiate cultural events in the University. The Committee makes plan and schedule of all the cultural events for the academic year. Events like COSAC and foundation day are celebrated every year in October. Various other occasions as AdulKalam Azad Jayanti, AtalBihariBajpayeeJayanti, SardarVallabhBhaiJayanti, ValmikiJayanti, Gandhi Jayanti, National festivals are celebrated with great zeal and enthusiasm.

### **18.11 TRAINING AND PLACEMENT CELL**

In the present contemporary and competitive environment, education is not only a mode of transmitting knowledge but also a tool that equips the students with requisite professional skills that prepare them for the upcoming job opportunities.

The Placement Cell of the University helps the students to identify organizations suited for training and future placement. It is dedicated to support the students in their pursuit to get jobs in various reputed organizations. In addition to this, the placement cell also conducts special lectures and workshops to update the students on current job opportunities and trends in their chosen area of study.
